



Waste Acceptance Policy (WAP) Regulated Medical Waste

Superior Medical Waste Disposal, LLC (“Superior”) requires full compliance with all applicable federal, state, and local regulations governing the identification, segregation, packaging, labeling, and transportation of regulated medical waste. The Customer, as the generator and shipper, is solely responsible for ensuring all waste is properly prepared in accordance with applicable laws, including but not limited to U.S. Department of Transportation (DOT) regulations.



Acceptable Waste

Superior accepts regulated medical waste generated from healthcare, research, and related activities, including:

- Sharps (properly contained)
- Blood and bodily fluid waste
- Contaminated personal protective equipment (PPE)
- Other materials defined as regulated medical waste under applicable law



Unacceptable Waste

The following materials are strictly prohibited unless otherwise agreed to in writing:

- RCRA hazardous waste or hazardous pharmaceuticals
- DEA-controlled substances
- Bulk chemotherapy waste
- Mercury, batteries, or heavy metals
- Chemical waste (including solvents, reagents, corrosives, ignitable materials)
- Radioactive materials
- Bulk liquids
- Non-infectious general waste
- Complete human remains (including heads, torsos, or fetuses)

Waste containing highly infectious agents requiring special handling under federal law must be properly treated prior to acceptance.



Packaging and Labeling Requirements

Customer is solely responsible for proper segregation, packaging, and labeling of all waste.

All regulated medical waste must:

- Be placed in approved, rigid, leak-resistant, and properly sealed containers
- Be packaged to prevent leakage, rupture, or exposure under normal transport conditions
- Utilize puncture-resistant containers for sharps
- Be labeled and prepared in accordance with applicable DOT regulations (including 49 CFR requirements)



Non-Conforming Waste

Superior reserves the right to refuse, reject, or return any waste that is:

- Improperly packaged, labeled, or segregated
 - Leaking, damaged, or unsafe to transport
 - Misrepresented or outside the scope of accepted waste
- Non-conforming waste may be returned to the Customer or redirected for proper disposal at Customer’s expense. Additional charges may apply.



Weight Limits

Individual containers exceeding safe handling limits (typically 50 lbs) may be refused or subject to additional charges.

Acknowledgment

Customer acknowledges that failure to comply with this Waste Acceptance Policy may result in refusal of service, additional charges, or other action as permitted under the Service Agreement.
